THOUGHTS FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Today's Scriptures tell us that it is to the smallest and humblest that the Lord will come. Consider **Bethlehem**: "Too small to be among the clans of Judah." Yet it is her womb that the very Son of God dwells. Now consider **yourself**: Perhaps you consider yourself too small or too insignificant for anything awesome ever to happen. Yet today you are given the opportunity to become the very dwelling place of God by listening to God's divine word and receiving the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist. In the town of Bethlehem, the world was changed forever. In the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary grew the One who would save the world from sin and death.
