Last Sunday's readings focused on the trials and sufferings of our Lord and the service to which we are called. Today's readings celebrate the joy that our faith in God brings. These two successive passages have strong parallels, Jesus asks the same question: "What do you want me to do for you?"

James and John asked Jesus for privilege, not understanding how much they were asking for. Bartimaeus, the blind man, knowing he cannot see, asked for the ability. He recognized Jesus as the Messiah and the "Master." After his encounter, he became a disciple.
